- AIDS Prevention and Control Act (1990), renamed HIV Infection Control and Patient Rights Protection Act (2007)
 Fees for treatment included in health care plan

 - Protect HIV patients from discrimination
- Laws regarding women / gender equality, combined with LGBTI rights:
 - Gender Equality Education Act (2004):
 - Covering different genders, sexual orientation, gender identity
 - Gender education in school
 - Act of Gender Equality in Employment (2006):
 - Employers must not discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation
 - Domestic Violence Prevention Act (2007):
 - Expand the scope of protection to gay and lesbian relationships
 - In 2006, first proposal of the "Same-sex Partner Law" in the Legislative Yuan
 - In 2015, Kaohsiung city to first open registration for civil partnerships •
 - In 2017, Constitutional Court: Gays and lesbians should enjoy the right to marry • laws

What we have **P**

- Lesbian and Gay Civil Rights Movement in Taipei (2000) → The first Taiwan Pride Parade (2003)
- More comprehensive education in gender equality
- Cooperation: Support from NGOs
- Collision and Dialogue within the System:
 - In 1986 Qi Jiawei became the first gay man proposed marriage equality; in 2000 he proposed a constitutional review;
 - in 2015 Qi and Taipei city proposed a constitutional review again
 - Lobbying politicians
 - Legislators supporting same-sex marriage
 - Gender equality committees on different levels of government

What we do?

DPP x Equal Rights

• Implementing Gender Equality Rights:

- Making it part of the presidential campaign
- Encouraging the local governments to open registration for civil partnerships
- Amending the employee benefits, extending same-sex partners working in the party the same protections as married party employees..

• Supporting LGBT Movements:

- Long-term support for the rights movement groups
- 2014: Production of "Democracy and Support for LGBT" stickers, issued at the parade.
- 2015: DPP Party Headquarters form a team to participate in Taiwan Pride Parade for the first time; creating rainbow themed items and distributing to LGBT-friendly stores to give out free of charge.
- 2016: second time participating in Taiwan Pride, inviting party workers to join in, passing out pride stickers.

What we do

2014/10/25

DPP Women's Affairs Department made "Democracy and Support for LGBT" stickers for the 12th annual Taiwan Pride, an on the eve of the parade, distributed these products to LGBT-friendly stores to be distributed for free.




2015/10/31


2016/10/29
