- String of Pearl Strategy across the Indian Ocean
- Overseas Bases and Security Agreements after GSI, GDI and GCI declarification: Djibouti, possibly in Ream (Cambodia), Solomon Island, Vanuatu



CHINESE MARITIME AGGRESSION

- East China Sea: Senkaku Island Intrusion
- Taiwan Proper (all around Taiwan)
- South China Sea: Against Philippine and Vietnam especially
- Increasing Assertive in Yellow Sea (ROK)

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South China Sea Issue

- China tactic: bilateral dealing toward claimant states; establishing allies in ASEAN to prevent ASEAN from reaching harmful position toward PRC
- Bilaterally: China deals with Philippine, Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei and Indonesia bilaterally in the dispute
- Multilaterally: dragged down ASEAN in the COC talk on SCS; utilizing some ASEAN members to prevent ASEAN from issuing common position which might jeopardize Chinese position
- Divide ASEAN into claimant states vs. nonclaimant states and deepen the differences

TAIWAN'S POSITION ON SCS (AS I UNDERSTOOD)

- Taiwan has two islands in SCS (Paratus and Itu Aba) Taipei considered them as its own territory
- Peaceful resolution through political talk and no violence, respect the UNCLUS
- Taiwan does not consider the "11 dashed line as national boundary line (different from China's 9 dashed line position)
- Taiwan does not accept 2016 Tribunal Ruling because: (1) it calls Taiwan as "Taiwan authority of China"; (2) Itu Aba ruled as a rock, not an island; and (3) The process has prevented Taiwan from presenting its own cases.
- Taiwan needs a Seat at the table for SCS Discussion

How to Call out Chinese Behavior?

- Philippine: ICAD (Illegal, Coercive, Aggressive and Destructive)
- Taiwan: Gray Zone; Quasi-Military Operation
- Calling out PRC Actions is not enough. What to do after calling out PRC actions really matters
- Chinese tactic against Philippine (South Sea Fleet) is different from its action on Japan and Taiwan (East Sea Fleet). They start to look similar (coast guard involvement)
- Can ASEAN reach one position toward PRC (and back up Philippine)?

READING

- Chinese maritime menace already is in East Sea, Taiwan proper and SCS. It could go to South Pacific and Indian Ocean in the future.
- Chinese behavior in SCS is not about history, it is about obtaining strategic dominance by expelling US presence back to east of Hawaii to control the whole Asia
- War on Taiwan will horizontally expand to East Sea (Japan), SCS (Philippine and Vietnam), South Pacific (US and Australia), Malacca Strait (Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia) and Indian Ocean (India)

RECOMMENDATION

- First Island Chain nation need to work together to counter Chinese ICAD/Gray Zone
- IPAC already focuses on China. Could CALD/LI also work on China and to facilitate the consolidation of SE Asia claimant states?
- Philippine to lead ASEAN in 2026: put East China Sea, SCS, Taiwan proper etc in the agenda of ARF, ADMM and EAS. Inviting US and the +5 nations(JP, SK, AU, NZ, IN) along with some like minded SE Asian countries to drive the COC discussion. (Need to prepare for PRC 2027 timeline)
