Framing the Space

- We are here to think for ourselves in the presence of others.
- The quality of our listening determines the quality of each other's thinking.
- As youth leaders, we must learn how to truly listen to build relationships.

What is a Thinking Environment?

- Conditions that help people think independently and clearly.
- Listening without interruption is a powerful act of respect.
- Active listening gives partners the space to develop ideas.

10 Components of a Thinking Environment

1	Attention	Giving undivided Presence
2	Equality	Equal speaking turns and respect.
3	Ease	Removing pressure or rush.
4	Appreciation	Recognizing strengths.
5	Encouragement	Creating safety to take risks.
6	Feelings	Allowing space for emotion.
7	Information	Sharing knowledge openly.
8	Diversity	Valuing different backgrounds and perspectives.
9	Place	Environment that signals respect.
10	Incisive Questions	Challenging limiting assumptions.

Active Listening	Listening to Respond	Passive Listening
Focus on the speaker's thinking	Focus on preparing your reply	Focus on absorbing information without engagement

Thinking Pairs

What to do?

- Pair by shared language
- 1 Listener & 1 Speaker at a time
- 5 minutes each, switch roles after 5 minutes

Rules:

- No interruption
- Reassure by nodding,
- Be patient, only ask: 'Anything else?' if speaker stops

- What bold ideas are worth exploring further?
